

**CBC** is now accepting applications for **6-week** internships the Spring and Summer of 2018 with:

**CBC News:** The National, News Network, On the Money, National Radio News (World at Six, The World This Hour), Syndicated Audio, CBC.ca (National Digital News Desk, Interactive, Features, Social Media, Online Toronto), Marketplace, the fifth estate, Local Toronto TV News, Local Toronto Radio Current Affairs (Metro Morning, Here and Now, Ontario Morning, Fresh Air), Parliamentary Bureau, Hamilton Bureau, Entertainment Unit, Investigative Unit, and Health, Science and Tech Unit.

Internships take place at the CBC Broadcast Centre in Toronto. In select cases, interns who indicate an interest may be assigned to our Digital Bureau in Hamilton or Parliamentary Bureau in Ottawa.

Students interested in interning at CBC regional bureaus other than those outlined above should contact those locations directly.

Internships are **unpaid**. Interns are responsible for accommodation and travel.

Please read the following **guidelines** concerning **CBC's** Internship requirements;

1. Students must be currently enrolled in a journalism program recognized by **CBC**
2. Internship must be a requirement of your program.
3. Students must not have already interned at the CBC.
4. Students must be in—or about to enter—their final year of studies at the time of the internship
5. Students must be available to spend six consecutive weeks on a full-time basis at CBC. Full-time does not mean trying to juggle studies and employment while undertaking an internship. Freelance work is permissible in certain cases.
6. Most shifts run Monday through Friday; some Thursday-Sunday and Friday-Monday shifts are available. Some shifts begin early in the morning or in late afternoon/evening.
7. CBC cannot accommodate non-consecutive schedules or individual requests outside of our full-time six-week model.
8. Interns must be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident. Although interns are not paid, CBC needs to ensure that they could be employed following their internships. International students can only be considered if they hold a work permit that is valid from the time of the application deadline until several months after the internship end date.

The cover letter should detail why you wish to intern at **CBC**, whether you prefer a placement at CBC News or CBC Network Talk, as well as preference for a specific program, department or area of programming. **CBC** will consider such requests but cannot guarantee accommodation.
