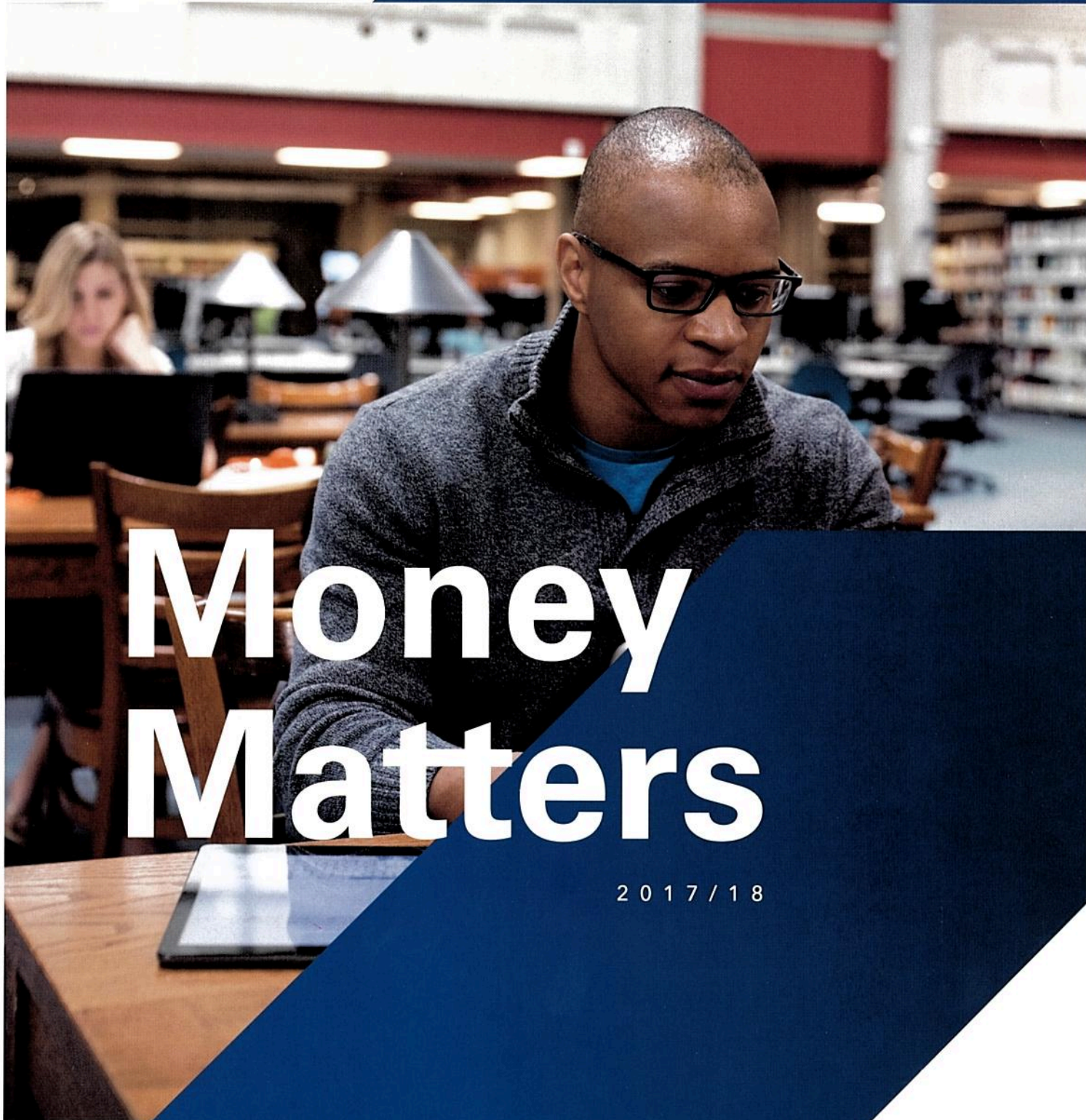

Scholarships and bursaries

At Mount Royal University, we want you to focus on your studies, not on paying your bills. We also want to recognize your hard work and academic achievement. With more than \$3.7 million in scholarships and bursaries available to Mount Royal students, it pays to apply.

Entrance Awards

If you are entering a degree, diploma or certificate program, you may be eligible for entrance awards.

How to apply for Entrance Awards

1. Apply for early admission from Oct. 1, 2016 to Feb. 1, 2017 at mru.ca/admission
2. MRU student ID number is required to apply for awards. ID will be sent to you by email.
3. Apply for scholarships and bursaries from Oct. 1, 2016 to March 1, 2017 at mru.ca/awards

ENTRANCE AWARD	CRITERIA	AMOUNT
President's Scholarship	Academic achievement, extracurricular activities and leadership	\$7,500 (\$3,750 Fall semester, \$3,750 Winter semester)
Entrance Awards for Academic Excellence	Academic achievement — 90% in top two Group A subjects 80% final average on 5 courses	\$1,000
Entrance Bursaries	Financial need	\$1,000
Additional Scholarships and Bursaries	Criteria varies	\$500 – \$5,000

In-course Awards

If you are currently enrolled at Mount Royal, you may be eligible for an in-course award, ranging in value from \$200 to \$10,000.

Apply for in-course awards online by visiting mru.ca/awards from Oct. 1, 2016 to March 1, 2017.

Student loans, grants and other awards

You may be eligible for financial assistance from the provincial and federal governments. These government loans, grants and bursaries are for students who lack the resources to fund their own education and who meet specific funding criteria.

Government loans

If you are a resident of Alberta, you can apply for government loans online at studentaid.alberta.ca

If you live outside Alberta, look into applying for student loan assistance from your home province or territory.

Benefits include:

- automatic assessment for grants and bursaries
- interest-free status while you study
- deferral of tuition fee payment

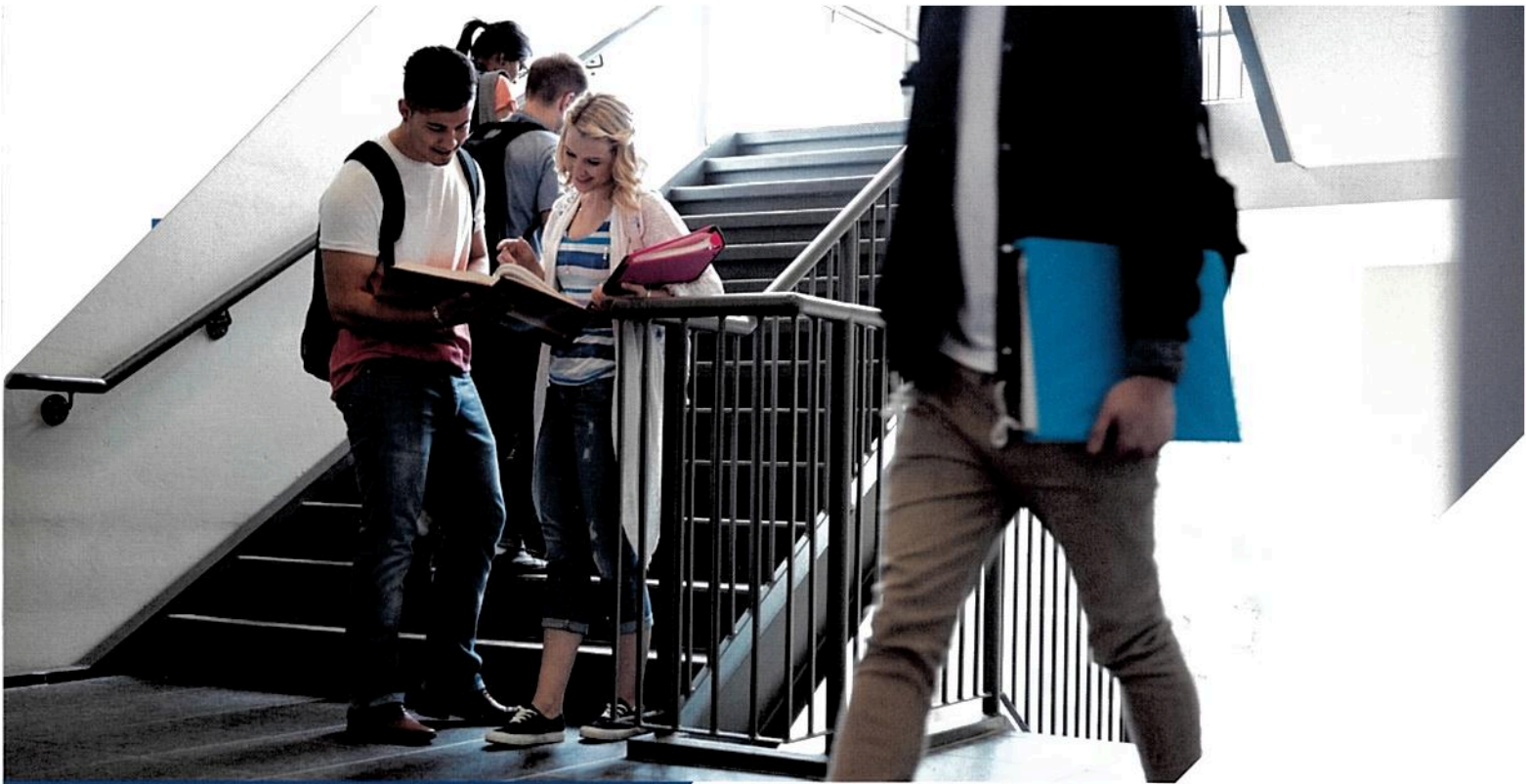

Other options

Jobs on campus
